# Year 7

#### Unit 1: The Elements of Music

The Western Classical Tradition

Students discover the elements of music. Students will explore how the different elements can be combined to create exciting and interesting pieces of music.

# **Unit 2: Rhythm Skills**

The Western Classical Tradition

Students will investigate different note values, that, when combined create rhythmic patterns which in turn form a piece of music. Students will explore how different rhythms can be layered together.

The Western Classical Tradition

Students look more closely at pitches in music learning a series of acronyms to learn the different pitches on a stave. Students are first introduced to the pentatonic scale.
